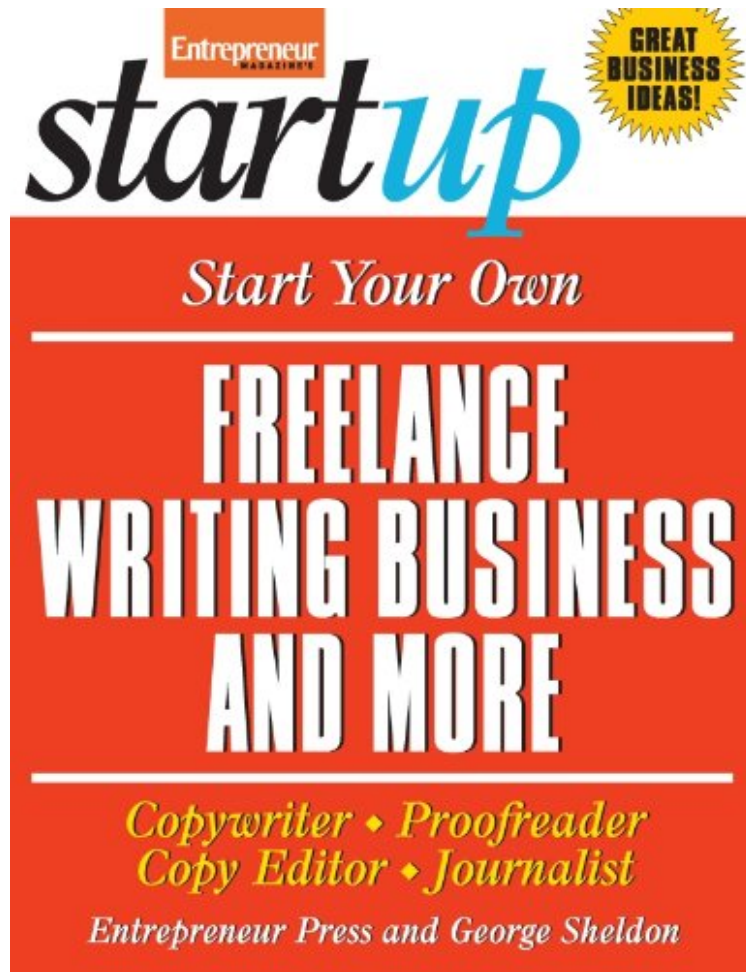

To get copyediting jobs, the book advises, write a simple introductory business letter to the business you want to work for. That's all the information it gives! When other books talk about querying magazines or book publishers, they give specifics on exactly what the letter should contain, how many paragraphs, what not to include, who to address it to, etc. This book gives no information at all. Should the letter be like a job application cover letter, a query to a magazine, a book query? The book never says, and I suspect it's because the author doesn't know and was too lazy to bother finding out. And the book is absolutely rife with copyediting and proofreading errors. That raises red flags right there. If I can copyedit better than a book that covers copyediting, then what use is the book to me?
