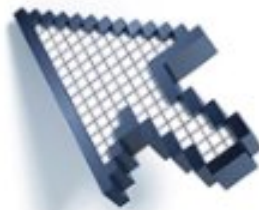

But first of all, this book is all of about starting and managing your own small business. Although web design is mentioned rather frequently and often used in examples

and quotes, this book has NOTHING to do with a CAREER as a web designer. Don't they have a series with the name like "Start Your Own Business ... ". This book more belongs there. Then, the author hides just so many ads. Again, please don't get me wrong - I have nothing against introducing good tools here and there (with adequate limits and caveats though, please), and sometimes I enjoy commercials. But blending the ads "naturally" in the text with speculations that readers may be (mis)lead is what I am not for. This actually leads to my biggest problem with the book - in the center of Mr. Tortorella's philosophy, it's all about "beat the market", which means just profiting from loopholes of the established and agreed practices and others' goodwill. Will someone clever be successful for a quite while with this philosophy? Absolutely yes. Will many profit from this approach for a short while? Probably yes too. But when these "good ideas" become published in a book, your safe bet probably is that this book is the last chance of those clever ones to steal some more money before they explore other loopholes. If you are enthusiastic about a CAREER as a web designer, I would advise that you look somewhere else. Sorry I don't have any recommendation yet because I just started my search. By the way I thoroughly read the whole book.
