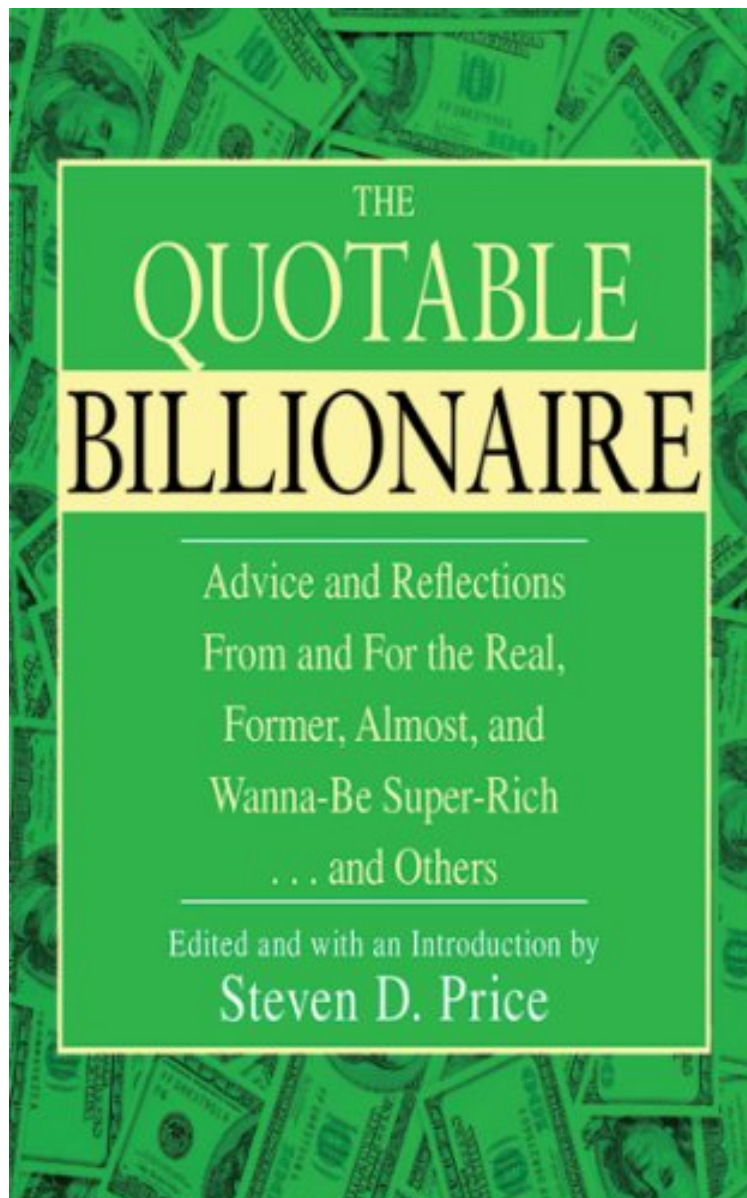

An Adequate Collections of QuotesBy TWThe Quotable Billionaire is filled with quotes on money, success, finance, and other related ideas. The book contains some real gems, but also a lot of surprisingly shallow quotes, which I guess is to be expected when quoting about money. The book suffers mildly in quality as many of the quotes are repeated, at times even only a few pages apart. One nice feature is that a list of the authors of the quotes is provided as an index each with an explanation describing who each author is and what his/her accomplishments are. However, for some unknown reason not every author made it to the list which seems a bit strange. The book is an adequate collection of quotes, although nothing beyond what you could find by doing some simple searches yourself.

What the super-rich and others have to say about money in these pages is sometimes enlightening, sometimes profound, often entertaining, and always revealing. Topics include wealth (“If you can actually count your money, then you are not really a rich man.”—J. Paul Getty); investing (“Only buy something that you’d be perfectly happy to hold if the market shut down for ten years.”—Warren Buffett); success (“The secret of success is to do common things uncommonly well.”—John D. Rockefeller); and leadership (“The buck stops with the guy who signs the checks.”—Rupert Murdoch). In addition are proverbs, quips, and other commentary on all aspects of having a fortune.
